



What Mining Legislation does Hazelwood Mine operate within?

- The mine works under two major pieces of Mining Legislation:
 - The Mineral Resources (Sustainable Development) Act 1990 (Vic)
 - The Mineral Resources (Sustainable Development) (Mineral Industries) Regulations 2013
- Mine Licence MIN 5004 sets out conditions by which the mine must operate.
- The Mine Work Plan Variation sets out how the conditions will be met by the mine and sets out the work methodology, including rehabilitation.
- In 2015, the State Government altered one of the mine's licence conditions to include a Risk Assessment and Management Plan (RAMP).




What is the current Mine Work Plan Variation?

- Development of the Northfield Project to maintain an uninterrupted supply of coal to the Hazelwood Power Station until 2025 and beyond in two phases.
- Phase 1 mining began in February 2004 under existing permits and licences and preparation of Phase 2 mining started in 2015 with the development of Northfield.
- The Environment Effects Statement (EES) also covered mining impacts for Phases 1 and 2 mining.

What is the Risk Assessment and Management Plan?

- The RAMP will form part of the 2016 Mine Work Plan Variation.
- The RAMP has identified four specific mine risk areas specific to the current work plan:
 - Mine Fire
 - Ground Control
 - Environment
 - Site Security and Emergency Response
- Critical Control Performance standards are generated and documented.



How is the Work Plan Variation to be varied in order to incorporate the RAMP?

- The RAMP will be formally incorporated its entirety as an annexure to the Work Plan Variation.
- The current Community Engagement Plan and Environmental Management Plan for Hazelwood will be reflected within appropriate sections of the Work Plan.
- The section dealing with risks will be amended and expanded to reflect the RAMP.
- Critical Controls are added to the Work Plan Variation.
- Consideration will be given to Recommendations 18 and 19 from the Second Mine Fire Inquiry.
